Beautiful is a coming-of-age story about one of America's most celebrated song writers: Carole King. Sure, you know her incredible solo career with albums like "Tapestry" and songs like "You've Got A Friend." But one of the most delightful and surprising parts of *Beautiful* is discovering how many brilliant and era-defining songs she wrote before you had ever heard of her. These treasures of the American Songbook were written with her first husband, Gerry Goffin – the central relationship of our story.



I won't give any of the songs away here, though a few page turns will reveal them... if you're into spoilers. However, those joyous musical discoveries are only part of the story you're about to see. At its core, *Beautiful* is about an extraordinarily gifted woman raised in a traditional world, who finds herself in the midst of major societal change: The Women's Liberation Movement, The Civil Rights Movement, The Sexual Revolution, among many others. Ultimately, the influence of these seismic shifts upends her relationship and forces her to question everything she believes. It's what leads her to discover what's most important: self-assurance and the power that comes when you stand up for what is right for you. Carole instinctively defied societal norms to pursue her career as a songwriter in a male dominated field, she just needed to translate that bravery into her relationships.

Carole wisely says in her opening remarks, "You know what's so funny about life? Sometimes it goes the way you want and sometimes it doesn't. And sometimes when it doesn't, you find something beautiful." The last few years have thrust us into another necessary social justice movement, and as we all work to address these issues, I hope you can find strength in Carole's story; always stick up for yourself and others, follow your dreams, and make the world a better place for everyone.

It's been an honor to recreate Marc Bruni's definitive Broadway production with Joyce Chittick (Choreographer) and Nick Williams (Music Director) – both veterans of the Broadway company and National tour. It always brings me such joy to dive back into Doug McGrath's script, which fills the rehearsal room with constant smiles and laughter. We're proud to bring you a cast full of veterans of the show, as well as welcoming a number of new folks to the family. And as you've come to expect from Ogunquit Playhouse, there are some new bells and whistles created just for you.

Beautiful has delighted audiences on Broadway and across the globe for over 6 years, and I'm thrilled that Ogunquit Playhouse is the launchpad for the show's next life.

CAROLE KING (Words and Music). Pop music would be very different without the contributions of Carole King, who at age 17 wrote her first #1 hit with Gerry Goffin, "Will You Love Me Tomorrow," for The Shirelles. The dozens of chart-topping hits Goffin and King wrote during this period became legendary, but it was 1971's Tapestry that took King to the pinnacle, speaking personally to her contemporaries, and providing a spiritual musical backdrop to the decade. More than 400 of her compositions have been recorded by over 1,000 artists, resulting in 100 hit singles and six Grammys.

GERRY GOFFIN (Words and Music) Born in Brooklyn in 1939, Gerry Goffin met Carole King at Queens College and their musical collaboration began almost immediately. They married in 1959 and that same year wrote their first hit song "Will You Love Me Tomorrow?" (The Shirelles). The duo penned more than 50 Top 40 hits including "The Locomotion," "Natural Woman," and "Up on the Roof." Goffin and King were inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame in 1987, and The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame in 1990. Goffin has left an indelible mark on American music.

BARRY MANN (Words and Music) has written the melodies to some of the most influential pop songs in musical history. In addition to "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling," the most-played song of the last century, and the songs heard in *Beautiful*, he composed later standards like "Somewhere Out There" (winner of two Grammys), "Here You Come Again," "Sometimes When We Touch," "Just Once," and "Don't Know Much." Together he and Cynthia Weil have amassed 112 pop, country, and R&B awards from Broadcast Music Inc. for significant radio air play. Barry has also been inducted into both the Songwriters Hall of Fame and the Rock and Roll Hall of Fame.

CYNTHIA WEIL (Words and Music) is known as the lyricist of classic songs such as "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling," the most-played song of the 20th century. In addition to the songs heard in *Beautiful*, she set the words to later standards including "Somewhere Out There," "Here You Come Again," "He's So Shy," "Just Once," and "Don't

Know Much," to name just a few. Cynthia has been inducted into the Songwriters Hall of Fame, The Rock and Roll Hall of Fame, honored with multiple Grammy nominations, and two Grammy Awards for "Somewhere Out There" as the Motion Picture Song of the Year and Song of the Year.



Celebrating the life of Douglas McGrath, who gave the world so much Beautiful art to love and appreciate. 1958-2022

DOUGLAS MCGRATH (Book) was an accomplished filmmaker, playwright, and actor. Before his passing in November 2022 at the age of 64, he was starring in the Off-Broadway production of the auto-biographical show *Everything's Fine* directed by John Lithgow. Previous to that, Douglas had directed the HBO documentary *Becoming Mike Nichols*, and collaborated with Woody Allen on the screenplay for *Bullets Over Broadway*, for which they received an Academy Award nomination. He wrote and directed the Oscar-winning *Emma* from the Jane Austen novel; *Company Man*; *Charles Dickens's Nicholas Nickleby*, which won the Best Ensemble Cast from the National Board of Review; *Infamous*; and the HBO documentary, *His Way*, nominated for an Emmy for Outstanding Nonfiction Special. His play *Checkers* opened the 30th anniversary season of New York's acclaimed Vineyard Theatre. His book for *Beautiful The Carole King Musical* was nominated for Tony, Drama Desk and Outer Critics Circle awards. McGrath began his career as a writer for *Saturday Night Live* in what was incontestably the worst year in the show's history. He has written essays on

the arts and politics for *The New Republic*, *The New Yorker*, *The Nation*, *The New York Times*, and *Vanity Fair*.

MARC BRUNI (Original Director) directed the Tony, Grammy, and Olivier Award winning *Beautiful The Carole King Musical* on Broadway, in the West End, US/UK Tours, and in Australia, winning the Helpmann and Green Room Awards for Best Direction of a Musical. 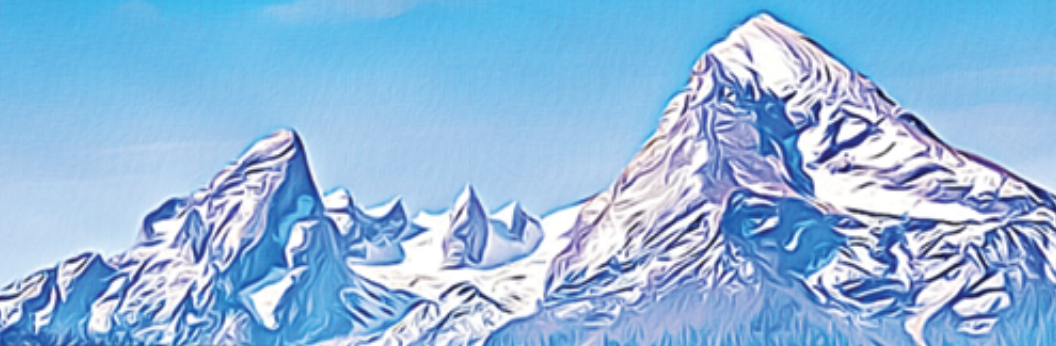

He is also the Technical Supervisor for the Playhouse's Arts Academy program. 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Watching *Beautiful – The Carole King Musical* and reveling in the remarkable music that she composed, with and without former husband and partner Gerry Goffin, I was reminded of the ones that got away.

I get asked, now and again, about interviews I wish I'd been able to score at Rolling Stone, but didn't. Elvis comes to mind. So does Sinatra. And then there's Carole King.

But King eluded us for years – six, in fact, after the release of *Tapestry* in 1971. Other artists who generally shied away from media met with Rolling Stone – Miles Davis, Van Morrison, Linda Ronstadt, Bob Dylan – even Janis Joplin, who felt betrayed by what she considered her “hometown paper” when Rolling Stone was based in San Francisco with its critical reviews of her work, tracked me down late one night

She should've been a snap. Unlike The King and The Chairman of the Board, Carole was in LA and accessible to us; she was one of us. A pop music phenomenon out of the early '60s; a pioneer singer-songwriter in the '70s; a resident of good ol' Laurel Canyon, which produced a good number of musicians and behind-the-scenesters we chronicled in Rolling Stone — The Byrds, The Doors, The Mamas & the Papas, Crosby Stills & Nash, Frank Zappa, Lou Adler (producer of King's greatest album, *Tapestry*). You name them; they were there, and they were ours.

to talk, on the phone, about her latest doings.

Not Carole King. As much as her record label and others around her may have counseled her to take advantage of the press, for promotional purposes, she resisted. In the early '70s, at the height of her success with *Tapestry* and its string of hit singles – “It's Too Late,” “I Feel the Earth Move,” “So Far Away” – the privacy of her life (a complicated one, as it turned out) was her highest priority.

So, as the Music Editor of the magazine, I was disappointed. Growing up, I loved her songs and appreciated the wit and craft that went into them, both music and words. Goffin and King, Leiber and Stoller, Pomus and Schuman, Mann and Weil. They were sure things.

I would probably have assigned the Carole King interview to myself, and happily added her to the list of songwriting artists I'd profiled, including Paul McCartney, Joni Mitchell, Paul Simon, Elton John, Bonnie Raitt, Smokey Robinson, James Taylor, Jackie DeShannon, Neil Diamond, Stevie Wonder, Ray Charles, Bob Dylan, Crosby Stills & Nash, and Barry Mann. Yes, the Mann who along with wife Cynthia Weil are depicted in *Beautiful* as King and Goffin's real-life buddies and songwriting rivals. (Formidable ones, too. "You've Lost That Lovin' Feeling," anybody?)

Those artists made the music I grew up with. Especially Goffin and King, whose credits I would notice on my 45 RPM records. "Will You Love Me Tomorrow" for the Shirelles. "Take Good Care of My Baby" and other hits for that echo of Buddy Holly, Bobby Vee; "One Fine Day" for the Chiffons; "Up on the Roof" for the Drifters. "The Loco-Motion," of course, for their babysitter. I also love the song King wrote with Howie Greenfield, "Crying in the Rain." Gorgeously sad, as performed by The Everly Brothers. Goffin and King wrote enough hits to fill a Top-40 survey on their own.

Watching *Beautiful*, I saw the story I could have written — only without the splashy, flashy renditions of all those great pop nuggets that King and her pals created. And without script writer Douglas McGrath's flair for comedy and drama.

In my article, just as it is on Broadway, the focus would have been on King and Goffin's music, and the unwritten rules they broke. "Will You Still Love Me Tomorrow," a smash hit for The Shirelles in 1961, was the first song about premarital sex — the early '60s phrase for a hookup.

Before it hit the stage, *Beautiful* was labeled a "jukebox musical," a pejorative that classified it with numerous previous productions that sought to attract Baby Boomers by giving them dressed up oldies, stitched together with a threadbare story line (often fictional) or no story at all.

Jersey Boys, the musical story of The Four Seasons, broke that mold and redefined that term. The Four Seasons' hits drove the production, certainly, but so did an engaging story about how the group formed, succeeded, fell apart, and came to terms.

Beautiful follows in that welcomed new direction. As McGrath told me, he worked to feature King and Goffin's songs "in the context of their personal story." So, go ahead and call it a jukebox musical. But music lovers of a certain

age will remember that the jukebox was a marvelous thing, an invitingly lit vault of their favorite tunes, theirs at the drop of a coin. And, as one critic noted in *The Huffington Post*, *Beautiful* does something more than spit out the hits. The performers, he wrote, “have populated *Beautiful* with well-defined characters with relatable human foibles.” As the *New York Times*’ critic noted in writing about the title song: “She delivers nothing you don’t expect from a jukebox musical. That’s a complex, revitalizing portrait of how a very familiar song came into existence, and the real conflicted person within the reluctant star.”

Long before *Beautiful* hit Broadway, Carole King made it clear she would not take an active role in its production. After her daughter and manager, Sherry Kondor, saw early readings and convinced her mother she should give it a chance, she agreed to attend a reading with her. Carole didn’t stay past the first act. “I can’t watch my life like this,” she told Sherry.



In a note to me for an article I wrote for the *San Francisco Chronicle*, before *Beautiful* opened a pre-Broadway run in town, King explained, “I had to leave... because the excellence of the writing and the actors’ interpretation awakened long buried emotions.” But, she concluded, it was a good play, “and I knew I couldn’t stand in its way...and now I give *Beautiful* my blessing.”

In doing so, she allowed *Beautiful* to happen; she even spoke with McGrath to give him her recollections, even as she was putting them down for her own memoirs.

Beautiful turns out to be not only about King. It’s also about the music of those times in the early ‘60s, when younger people were beginning to write their own songs. It’s about the way that music was created, performed, and sold, and about what it meant to an entire generation.

It’s not a surprise, and quite all right that King initially stayed away from *The Carole King Musical*, from her own story. Her choice is part of that story. But when she did sneak into the Broadway Theatre one evening, she found that *Beautiful* is more than one of her songs; more than the wonderful, albeit sometimes painful story of a talented young composer who epitomized some of the best and most significant qualities of her times. That it is, in fact, rather beautiful.
